

CPP30411 - CERTIFICATE 111 IN SECURITY OPERATIONS (WITHOUT H6 FIREARMS TRAINING)



COURSE PURPOSE: The course is designed to qualify persons as Frontline Managers within the security industry and to qualify for CBS (SA) license requirements for **Guarding with a Firearm & Body Guarding**.

COURSE PRE-REQUISITES: Persons wishing to apply for a security licence need to be “fit and proper persons” to obtain a licence. Persons with certain types of criminal convictions may not be eligible for licensing. Applicants will also need a current SA driver’s licence.

Suitability to hold a security licence will be assessed by Consumer and Business Services (CBS) once training is completed and a security licence application is lodged with them. State Government fees apply - details available at www.cbs.sa.gov.au

PRECOURSE INTERVIEWS & LLN ASSESSMENTS: Pre - course interviews are conducted before enrolment to assess applicant’s ability and suitability for the security industry.

It is recommended that applicants have a good standard of general health and fitness to suit industry requirements.

It is also recommended that applicants have Literacy & Numeracy skills at Year 10 equivalent. A LLN assessment is conducted as part of the pre-course interview to ensure applicants are able to complete the require course work.

COURSE OUTLINE: This course covers the following competencies that need to be completed at Certificate 111 in Security Operations level **WITHOUT THE H6 FIREARMS COMPONENT**

COURSE DURATION: This “blended” course runs for 5 days plus external course work/projects if completed “stand alone”.

COURSE FEES: The course fee is **\$695** for the full 5 day course program

AWARD: Successful students will be awarded “**CPPSEC30411 - Certificate 111 in Security Operations**” - minimum requirement for this award is 7 core and 5 elective units

Note: CBS requires that some Certificate 111 in Security Operations competencies (** see below) is mandatory for General Guarding, Body Guarding and Crowd or Venue Control Licenses. (Minimum requirement for this award is 8 core and 6 elective units).

ATTENDANCE & EXTERNAL MODE TRAINING PROGRAM

This course program is completed through a combination of attendance and external modes. The more theoretical components may be completed “off site” whilst the practical

components are completed through attendance as programmed regularly throughout the year. Practical sessions are delivered between 0845 and 1630 Mon to Fri on the days scheduled.

IMMEDIATE START

This course design allows applicants to start immediately upon enrolment. Once enrolled, candidates will receive Learner Guides and Assessments that they can start work on immediately. These units cover the more theoretical components of the course.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

For the practical/attendance components of the course students simply arrange with our training coordinator which programmed practical sessions & dates they wish to attend to suit their own timetable/availability. This will allow students to complete the course at their own pace
